

Dental Crowns Penticton

A crown or cap is a tooth fixture specifically fabricated to re-establish to its natural functioning the anatomical exteriors of a broken or fractured tooth. Anatomical exteriors of a tooth are those areas that are observable above the gum line.

Typically, crown restorations are only applied when there is a generous portion of the tooth left to build from. The filling materials call for sufficient surface area to fasten with the dental glues or the crowns will require continual repairing.

A tooth fixture is prepared prior to a crown being permanently bonded on. This reconstructive process is often an oral health professionals preferential treatment alternative because it results in a durable and lasting restoration with a high level of aesthetic appeal.

The two most utilized types of dentistry crowns used in our day are porcelain combined to metal and a ceramic jacket crown. Crowns with porcelain fused to metal are commonly applied on posterior teeth because they offer greater stability and strength throughout activities like biting and chewing. The face or veneer of the crown is built of ceramic materials that offer an organic and natural look. The ceramic jacket crown is a slim metallic shell covered by layers of porcelain to match the translucency and shadings of an existing tooth. This dental fixture is normally only used for anterior teeth.
