Today's advancements in dental materials allows for perfectly natural tooth-colored dental cosmetics that make restorative dental treatments much more resilient than in previous years. In addition, oral health care providers are currently using more moderate cosmetic procedures to sustain as much of your natural tooth structure as possible.

The many aesthetic therapies include composite resin bonding, onlays/inlays, teeth bleaching and whitening, dental implants, dental veneers, smile makeovers, and full mouth reconstructions.

Inlay & Onlay Fillings

Inlays as well as Onlays fillings are made from ceramic porcelain or composite resin materials that offer a long-lasting and cosmetic means to seal a tooth with structural damage or tooth decay. On one hand, traditional fillings are molded into place while at the oral health doctors office, inlays and onlays are custom fabricated in a professional dental laboratory before being properly bonded into position by your oral health care professional.

Synthetic Resin Bonding

Busted, cracked, chipped, corroded and discolored teeth can be refurbished or have their look enhanced using a treatment called composite bonding. Composite resin materials look and feel like ordinary dentin and tooth enamel when positioned into a tooth cavity or onto a tooth's exterior, may be contoured, sculpted and hardened into shape with a high-intensity light. The results will eventually blend in with the rest of the natural teeth and supporting structures to help improve your overall smile.

Teeth Whitening

Teeth whitening and bleaching treatments have become the most requested cosmetic dental procedure. They have become so common due to the dramatic effects these treatments can have on teeth discoloured from smoking, coffee, wines, or eating certain foods.

Porcelain and Composite Resin Veneers

Composite resins or ceramic laminates can be cemented to the surface of teeth to repair and correct cracks or chips or just to better the appearance of a severely discoloured tooth. Veneers may also be used to cover gaps in your teeth or to improve severe discolouration that has not been successful with bleaching systems.

Dental Implants

Dental Implants are artificial tooth root replacements used when a patient has lost a tooth or many teeth. When used it is part of a dental prosthetic that can enhance a smile or be used to give structure to an area lacking a foundation. Absent teeth may cause the face to sag or collapse, rendering an older appearance.

Makeover for the Smile

A smile makeover involves a broad oral assessment of your smile aesthetics in order to enrich your overall appearance. Frequently one or more treatments, such as veneers, implants, gum sculpting, and advanced teeth whitening possibly will be essential for several teeth on both lower and upper arches to attain the appearance that you want.

Full Mouth Reconstruction

Full mouth reconstructions are different from the smile make-over in that there is also a focus on matters relating to the functioning of the teeth. These could include bone, bite, structure, muscles, and teeth matters. At some point in your cosmetic assessment, your oral health care professional may possibly suggest certain necessary treatments to fix these structural concerns.
